

GEORGE LANSING RAYMOND.

**Educator and Author, 89, Dies in
Washington.**

WASHINGTON, July 11.—George Lansing Raymond, educator and author, died of pneumonia tonight at Garfield Hospital. He was 89 years old. He was graduated from Williams in 1862 and from Princeton Seminary in 1865. He taught at Williams from 1874 to 1880; was Professor of Oratory at Princeton from 1880 to 1905 and Professor of Esthetics at George Washington University here from 1905 to 1912.

Professor Raymond was born in Chicago, the son of Benjamin Wright and Amelia Porter Raymond. His father was one of the early Mayors of Chicago. He was a member of several clubs, including the Authors, Century and National Arts of New York, the Authors of London and the Cosmos of this city.

Funeral services will be held at the home on Saturday morning. Burial will be in Princeton on Saturday afternoon.

Professor Raymond is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Tyler Dennett, of this city, and by four grandchildren.
